



SPIRITUOUS LIQUOR PERMIT

This permit, *with appropriate approval signature(s)*, entitles the user (s) to consume spirituous liquor as described in Sahuarita Town Code, Article 12.25 and consistent with the requirements on the permit application. This permit does not allow the user (s) to sell any spirituous liquor on Town property. If the user wishes to sell spirituous liquor, a permit application can be obtained from the Arizona Department of Liquor Licenses & Control.

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Permit is non-transferable. 2. Permit is only valid for date and location identified on permit. 3. Glass beverages are not permitted. 4. Permit holder is responsible for conduct of group members. 5. Area must be left clean and in good condition. (Any property damage occurring will be the responsibility of the permit holder) 6. Obnoxious behavior or excessive noise will not be permitted. 7. Park hours as posted will be observed. 8. Applicants must retain permit on Park premises at all times and available at request by police or park officials. 9. Sale of spirituous liquor strictly prohibited, unless proper permission has been given through the Arizona Department of Liquor Licenses & Control & Town Officials. (permit must be attached) 10. Permit holder will maintain appropriate music volume so as not to disturb other facility users. 11. **Permit holder will be responsible for assuring that all members of his/her group are of legal drinking age according to Arizona State Law.

Permit applicant has read the conditions above, received a copy of Sahuarita's Town Code Article 12.25 and agrees to be responsible for any misconduct, property damage etc., of the persons consuming spirituous liquor under this permit,

Chapter 12.25 SPIRITUOUS LIQUOR ON PARK PREMISES

Sections:

12.25.010 General.

12.25.020 Open container.

12.25.030 Exemptions.

12.25.010 General.

A. No person shall consume spirituous liquor in town parks or recreation areas, including parking lots and driveways, except that beer and wine may be consumed when the appropriate permit is obtained from the director, consumption remains in compliance with the terms of said permit, and such consumption is in adherence with all state laws. In no case shall the issuance of such permit be construed to grant permission to drink to excess.

B. "Spirituous liquor" includes, but is not limited to, alcohol, brandy, whiskey, rum, tequila, mescal, gin, vodka, mead, wine, port, ale, beer, any malt liquor, malt beverage, absinthe or compound or mixture of any of them, or of any of them with any vegetable or other substances, alcohol bitters, bitters containing alcohol, and any liquid intoxication, fruits preserved in ardent spirits and beverages containing more than one-half of one percent of alcohol by volume. "Beer" means any beverage obtained by the alcoholic fermentation, infusion, or decoction of barley malt, hops, or other ingredients not drinkable, or any combination of them. 12.25.020 Open container.

Notwithstanding STC [12.25.010](#), it is unlawful for any person to consume or have an open container of any spirituous liquor within parking lots or vehicles within a town park. [Ord. 2001-11; prior code § 15-5-2.]

12.25.030 Exemptions.

The following areas are exempt from this chapter:

A. Town golf courses during established hours of operation. [Ord. 2001-11; prior code § 15-5-3.]

12.25.040 Permits.

The director is empowered to issue permits authorizing the consumption and possession of beer and wine in public parks to individuals as well as event organizers who may obtain such a permit for the attendees of an organized event for which an event permit has been issued. The director is empowered to adopt rules and procedures for the issuance of such permits, in accordance with STC [12.25.010](#). [Ord. 2001-11; prior code § 15-5-4.]
