General Plan Community Survey 2 Executive Summary

Introduction

The community survey was administered over the course of approximately one month from mid-November 2024 to early January 2025. Garnering 224 responses, across five distinct topical surveys (Land Use & Growth Areas; Transportation and Public Facilities & Services; Parks, Recreation & Open Space; Environmental, Water Resources & Energy; and Economic Development & Cost of Development), feedback was gathered from residents on a revised vision as well as revised General Plan goals, which are key aspects of the plan. This summary encapsulates the key points and feedback from the General Plan community survey, highlighting the areas of agreement, concerns, and suggestions for consideration as part of the Sahuarita General Plan Update.

Respondent Demographics

Age Groups: When asked about the age of survey respondents, the largest age group were those 65 years or older, however, the majority of responses overall did come from residents within the Town's workforce population (i.e. age 25 – 64). Similar to the first survey, this displays that survey responses include perspectives from a spectrum of potential needs and/or lifestyles (i.e. entering the workforce, established in the workforce, exiting the workforce).

Neighborhoods: As seen in the attached Full Survey Results, respondents across the topical surveys come from various neighborhoods across the Town. This dispersal helps to show a geographic distribution of perspectives within the survey results.

Revised Vision Statement Feedback

Based on feedback from Community Survey #1 the Vision Statement revised to be shorter and make it more straightforward and focused.

Revised Vision Statement

"We envision a future where the Town of Sahuarita is known as a community with a high quality of life driven by its commitment to social, economic, and environmental sustainability; a future where Sahuarita is an attractive and diverse community in which people choose to live and businesses choose to locate; and a future where Sahuarita's appeal is enhanced through the recognition and protection of its cultural, historic, and environmental resources, as well as its natural open space, dark skies and scenic views."

The revised Vision Statement generally received positive feedback with comments noting additional ideas they would like to see incorporated, and mixed opinions about specific topics.

Comments included:

- Need to include educational system and public safety in the vision.
- Mixed opinions on the importance of cultural, historic, and environmental protection, as well as sustainability.
- Need to include additional language about visitors & tourism

Goal Feedback

Land Use & Growth Areas

Overall, the revised Land Use & Growth Areas goals received positive feedback. Each goal, except for one, had at least 70% of respondents agree that the goal will help implement the long-range vision for Sahuarita. The one exception had 62% of respondents agree. Overall comments on the goals were:

- Need to maintain the small-town feel of Sahuarita
- Need for increased services like restaurants, shopping, healthcare

Transportation and Public Facilities & Services

Overall, the revised Transportation & Public Facilities goals received positive feedback. Each goal had at least 80% of respondents agree that the goal will help implement the long-range vision for Sahuarita. Overall comments on the goals were:

- Need to balance of future amenities across all neighborhoods and not just within the specific plan zoned neighborhoods.
- Need for better access, more traffic signals and additional capacity as the town continues to grow

Parks, Recreation & Open Space

Overall, the revised Parks, Recreation & Open Space goals received positive feedback. Each goal had at least 80% of respondents agree that the goal will help implement the long-range vision for Sahuarita.

Overall comments on the goals were:

- The need to preserve the natural desert for recreation and ecological balance is a priority.
- Providing activities for all age levels is a priority
- Look to other municipalities in the region for ideas.

Environmental, Water Resources & Energy

Overall, the revised Environmental, Water Resources, & Energy goals received positive feedback. Each goal had at least 80% of respondents agree that the goal will help implement the long-range vision for Sahuarita. Overall comments on the goals were:

- The need to preserve the natural desert and ecological balance is a must
- Questions about how some of the goals will be implemented
- Ideas for the implementation of some of the goals

Economic Development & Cost of Development

Overall, the revised Economic Development & Cost of Development goals received positive feedback. Each goal, except for one, had at least 80% of respondents agree that the goal will help implement the long-range vision for Sahuarita. The one exception had 75% of respondents agree. Overall comments on the goals were:

- Creating partnerships with U of A / Pima Community College to get a highly educated labor force that is home grown.
- Skepticism on whether the goals are feasible
- Providing examples and removing some of the redundancy within the goal language



- Needs to include "active lifestyles"
- A little wordy but it ok
- Sounds like a great vision!
- Q: Survey? or affirmation of established directives/direction?
- I believe it is a good statement. I feel there could possibly be something more mentioned about our educational system here.
- Recognition and protection of environmental resources adversely effect the culture history, natural open spaces and desirability to live in a community.
- One reason people move/stay in Sahuarita is because of the quality education SUSD provides. Maybe add something like "driven by its commitment to social, economic, educational and environmental sustainability;"
- Remove "diverse" and replace the word environmental with natural
- What's missing is something about Town's commitment to public safety. The primary reason I live here is safety. SPD responds to every call within minutes, not hours or days like Tucson Police. Without public safety, none of the other reasons matter. Those of us who are natives to Tucson, know how quickly Sahuarita can "become another Midvale".
- Choose to live, locate and visit! WHAT ATTRACTS VISTORS?
- "...People choose to live and businesses choose to locate" feels a little redundant. Maybe "...Sahuarita is a vibrant hub that attracts new residents and businesses, offering growth and opportunity..." I like that the second half acknowledges the importance of preserving our open spaces because they are often a large part of what brings people here rather than to Tucson.
- Like

- *a stronger commitment to recycling and water conservation*
- *Economic should precede (indicative of priority) social and environmental sustainability - since economic advancement improves the other two. Remove 'diverse' since it implies this is a priority of the local government and it should not be, since the people who move here naturally make it diverse. An attractive community will attract diverse crowds naturally - so it shouldn't be in the vision statement. Rephrase to say 'enhanced through the cultural, historic, and environmental...' remove 'recognition and protection'. Overall the statement looks good!*

- *It is a little "wordy", but hits key points.*


each goal. Please review the following revised goals and their new descriptions and provide feedback while keeping the following question in mind.

Land Use

1. LU-1: Promote high quality design and character in new development.

Description: Sahuarita is committed to delivering a high quality of life through the utilization of thoughtful design and the cultivation of a sense of place and small-town feel. By balancing growth with the management of land resources and preservation of existing developments that contribute to Sahuarita's unique character, residents will continue to enjoy safe and convenient access to all the amenities and services the town has to offer.

Adding more subdivisions is not creating a small-town feel.



Sahuarita should look to bring in attractive employers to our area so people can enjoy working closer to home.


I realize growing the TOS creates more revenue for the town, however, it takes away from the beauty of what once was Sahuarita.

Sahuarita should utilize solar a lot more at Town Hall and wherever it can to power the Town's light and AC systems.



Small town feel - nothing being developed still feels like that.


Though the hope is to create a sustainable future for Sahuarita, the constant demand to increase the town, its services, and population only lines the pockets of the developers.

Stop building homes, there are too many now.



Transportation

- TRN-1:** Provide an efficient, reliable, accessible, and safe transportation system.

Description: An effective transportation system is comprised of a network of streets each with its own designation, function, and capacity within the system. Each segment contributes to the interconnectivity of the system. Therefore, for a system to operate efficiently, it is essential for there to be a well-connected and functional street network that is easy to access and navigate, reliable, safe, cost-effective and in harmony with adjacent land uses.

Rancho Sahuarita new and old needs better access to larger surface streets. The area south of el toro has one street out. Traffic is going to be a nightmare just like northern Rancho.


More stop are needed. some major roads i.e.: Rancho Sahuarita Blvd need to be widened as population continues to grow

The goal is to provide for ease of mobility regardless of how you choose or are able to get around, where you live, your income or your age.



Comments:



3. TRN-3: Effectively coordinate with regional and interagency transportation planning programs and projects.

Description: Various Federal, State, local government, and non-governmental entities fund and manage pieces of the transportation system that leads into and services within the Town. Coordinating the efforts of all of these entities with the long-term vision of the Town will be important to enhancing overall mobility across Sahuarita..



Comments:



So underscore the need to not just coordinate but also to *safeguard* the interests of the Town of Sahuarita from being overrun by transportation projects at the Federal, State, and Pima County level.*

Coordinate this with wellness plans to encourage walking and cycling.

4. TRN-4: Construct and maintain transportation improvements in a logical, equitable and timely fashion.

Description: While street construction and expansion improvements are important to address existing and future transportation needs, maintenance of existing street facilities will require the attention of the Town.




