## Early Voters to Receive Notice and Make Choices

Starting today, Pima County voters who are on the Permanent Early Voter List will receive a Notice in the mail regarding the upcoming Primary Election, August 4, 2020. Almost one third of voters receiving the Notice are “independent” or “party not designated” voters, so they have the option to choose which political party’s ballot they would like to receive for the Primary Election.

“We are required by Arizona statute to mail this Notice and tell voters the dates of the upcoming Primary and General Elections, and the dates ballots will be mailed to them,” says F. Ann Rodriguez, Pima County Recorder.

How to complete the card:

- Voters who are members of a recognized political party may update information like a new address, or a temporary address where they would like their ballot to be mailed
- Voters who are “independent” or “party not designated” may select which political party ballot they want to receive
- By selecting a political party, it does not change your voter registration to that political party
- If you return the form, you must sign and provide date of birth
- Fold, seal, and mail the postage-paid card
- If voters do not have changes, there is no need to return the card.

Voters not on the Permanent Early Voter List may want to vote by mail this year. Even if voters usually vote at the polls, they may request an early ballot in 2020 in two ways:
